The Nursing program at Cayuga Community College prepares the student for entry into the profession of Nursing. Upon graduation, students receive the Associate in Applied Science degree in Nursing and are eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN). The overall passing rate for Cayuga nursing students exceeds state and national averages.

With a balance of courses in general education and nursing, the curriculum includes the theoretical knowledge and clinical practice needed to provide nursing care for individuals throughout the life span. Learning experiences take place in the classroom, nursing laboratory, and a variety of clinical settings.

Employment opportunities for entry-level graduates include hospitals, ambulatory care, skilled nursing facilities, and community agencies.

National Accreditation



Accreditation of Cayuga's Nursing program by the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission (NLNAC) ensures high-quality preparation for entry into the professions, and facilitates transfer to four-year institutions.

Admission

Cayuga has a separate application and admission process for the Nursing program.

- Nursing program admission is competitive.
- Advisement is extremely important to ensure proper sequencing of courses.
- A pre-admission Nursing Entrance Exam is required.
- College or high school biology and chemistry are prerequisites, as is a math placement score indicating proficiency in algebra. Nursing ABC courses are accepted.
- Fall application deadline is January 15.
- Auburn campus admits every fall.
- Fulton campus admits every other fall, even years.
- LPNs may challenge NURS 101.
