Accelerated Studies for Adults Program

ASAP is a convenient, affordable solution for working professionals to achieve their educational and career goals. Students meet in a seminar format which encourages both experiential and reflective learning. Each degree program has been developed to meet area work force demands. Career progression is available for business management, criminal justice, nursing, and social work professionals.

Cohort model

ASAP students are working adults returning to college to pursue career advancement or changes that require an advance degree. Sharing work background and life experiences with other non-traditional learners will develop a broader perspective and a unique depth of learning.

Convenient schedule

There are three convenient starting dates each year and programs can be completed

within 17 – 24 months. ASAP students choose to take one course at a time while attending class one night each week for four hours. Classroom work requires active participation and weekly homework includes reading, research papers, and reaction essays.

Faculty leadership

The accelerated courses are taught by full time Keuka faculty and some adjunct faculty. All professors are highly credentialed and



have work experience in their fields. Each cohort of students is assigned a faculty advisor who provides a consistent level of support and guidance.
